May the God of Christmas be to you the God of every Day God bless you all



### PRESBYTERY NEWS

Most of you may be aware that there are big changes happening throughout the Church of Scotland because of a continued shortage of ministers and declining attendances in all areas. Caithness is no exception to this and, in common with other Presbyteries have had to devise a Mission Plan to reflect these changes. In our Presbytery the allocation of full time minister posts has been reduced from 9.1 to 5.5 and we also have to reduce the number of Buildings being used because of the maintenance costs etc. The proposed Plan included a proposal to close Dunbeath Church but the Draft Mission plan is currently suspended as Presbytery voted against the final Draft on 1<sup>st</sup> December. Discussions now have to take place with Edinburgh to find a way forward. Your prayers would be much appreciated.
